**A Resolution Opposing Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation D/B/A National Grid Rate Hike**

**OPPOSING NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION D/B/A/ NATIONAL GRID RATE HIKE**  
Pursuant to Section 153 of the County Law.

- I. **WHEREAS**, Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid has proposed changes to its electric and gas delivery rates and practices, and

- II. **WHEREAS**, the proposed rate hike would result in total monthly increases for the average residential customer of approximately \$18.92 (15%) for electric and \$18.34 (20%) for gas, and
- III. **WHEREAS**, this drastic rate increase will create significant challenges for communities, businesses and families who are already struggling financially, possibly causing even more residents to flee the state, and
- IV. **WHEREAS**, these proposed increases will also likely be passed on to consumers and residents in the form of higher product costs and taxes, and
- V. **WHEREAS**, this situation further highlights problems with the state's unaffordable and unsustainable energy goals and climate policies, including the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA), and the significant costs associated with implementing them, and
- VI. **WHEREAS**, this is a proposed rate increase caused by financially irresponsible policies with no grounding in cost benefit analysis or rational economic considerations, and now, therefore, be it

not practical or warranted, and be it further

- II. **RESOLVED**, that the Village of Little Valley Board of Trustees hereby strongly urges Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid to reconsider its proposed rate increase which threatens to jeopardize economic stability for numerous families and businesses, and be it further
- III. **RESOLVED**, that the Village of Little Valley also strongly urges other municipalities and counties to go on record opposing the proposed rate increases in massive public protect, and be it further
- IV. **RESOLVED**, that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Kathy Hochel, the New York State Legislature, New York State Association of Counties, Senator George Borrello, Assemblyman Joseph Sempolinski, and any other party deemed necessary and proper.


